

ATRIP I & RAMP

- Between ATRIP and RAMP, nearly \$1 billion was made available to counties/municipalities for road and bridge improvements
- All 67 counties received funds
- Funded over 1100 projects
- 407 bridges were replaced

ATRIP II



- Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program-II
- Created in the Rebuild Alabama Act of 2019
- Annual program
- Provides funding of \$30,000,000.00 to \$50,000,000.00 per year
- For projects of local interest on the state-maintained highway system
- \$2,000,000 maximum funding per project for FY 2021



Rebuild Alabama Annual Grant Program



- Another ALDOT administered transportation infrastructure grant program created in the Rebuild Alabama Act of 2019
- Applications may be submitted by any county or municipality within the State
- Can be used for any classified road or bridge that is open to public traffic



Rebuild Alabama Annual Grant Program





- Funding is only available for eligible construction activities
 - No Preliminary Engineering, Right-of-Way, Utility Relocation, Construction Engineering & Inspection or Materials Testing costs will be eligible
- \$250,000 maximum funding per project for FY 2021


